<u>Course Description:</u> An introduction to early childhood education including historical and social foundations trends and the philosophies of various programs, diversity, inclusion, and awareness of value issues. The primary purpose of this course is to help students gain an understanding of the profession. Current theories in early childhood education will be presented along with historical approaches.

Assignment Descriptions:

- 2. Newspaper Article/Summary.Response 20 pts

- **6. Research Paper (100 pts):** You will select an early childhood education theorist or model to research. Some suggestions you might want to write about include: Jean Jacques Rousseau, Johann Heinrich Pestalozzi, Friedrich Froebel, Froebel's Kindergarten Gifts, Maria Montessori, Jean Piaget, Vygotsky, Maslow's Theory, Benjamin Bloom, Montessori Programs, Reggio Emilia Programs, If there is another topic that interests you, visit with me about it. Your research paper should:
 - a) 4 6 typewritten pages, double-spaced
 - b) include three credible sources. One reference can be your textbook
 - c) Use APA format
 - d) Include a reference page
- 8. Management Strategy File (120 pts): This assignment will be done in three sections:
- a) Setting up Classroom: For part (a) you will need to write a 1-2 typewritten page, double-spaced paper describing how you would set up your classroom and why. Think about how you would set up the classroom that is easy for children to move around in, places for individual student work, small group work and whole group settings. Also describe how your classroom setting will encourage positive behavior.
- b) Transitions: Transitions are activities a teacher uses to move children from one activity to the next. Write a list of at least 10 transitions you could use in an early childhood class. Each transition should include a clear description telling how to implement the transition into your classroom. Your description should be clear enough for another teacher to follow.

- c) Procedures you would use to guide child behavior: This part of your Management Strategy File should include strategies you might use for the following behaviors:
- a) hitting another child
 - b) taking an object from another child
 - c) disruptive behavior during whole group activity
 - d) does not interact with other children
 - e) bosses other children around
 - f) has difficulty taking turns
 - g) finds it difficult to follow instructions
 - h) inappropriate language
 - i) takes things that don't belong to them
 - j) child is delayed in social/emotional development
